

# Sutter Buttes Regional Land Trust

SPRING 2021

2020 started off as most years do. It was a time of a fresh beginning from the humdrum of the previous year ending, in the hope of; "well, we had a good year in 2019, next year will be better". For some it was the planning of crops and new crop rotations, new projects to start, putting the finishing touches on the old projects, taking a winter break or simply to be glad that we got through another year.

For the land trust, we had hoped to be able to get closer to signing off on a high value agricultural conservation easement. We were also planning our fundraising program for the new year and were looking forward to planning our art auction as partners with the Middle Mountain Interpretive Hikes' Annual Sunset Serenade fundraiser in May. The auction portion of the event was to have been our major fundraiser for the year. The 2021 Sutter Buttes Calendar planning was starting to take shape and we already had a date at the Sutter County Museum for the calendar sale rollout in August plus a reception and a gallery showing of the winning photographs of each month by and for the photographers who had submitted the images. We were also actively working on and planning our application to the Land Trust Alliance for our re-accreditation which is renewed every 5 years. Our current accreditation expires in 2022 and the application is due about a year in advance. With all these plans for a busy and hopefully productive new year, we were starting to feel confident that 2020 would be our year to shine. However, it was not to be.

In late February and March Murphy's Law took over our thinking. A new and dangerous respiratory disease called SARS-CoV-2

(renamed to COVID-19) that had no known cure was ravaging the world population. The reactions to this caused all forms of government to issue quarantine and stay at home orders to try to combat the spread of the scourge. Travel, both international and domestic, was curtailed or outrightly banned. Events were cancelled outright or with no word of postponement to a later date. The country's economy was effectively shut down. People had lost their jobs, and those that were still able to go to work had jobs that were deemed essential.

I would like to be able to tell you that the land trust was not affected by all this. Sadly, that is not the case. We were left scrambling for ideas to combat the situation that we were in just like everyone else. Fundraising, membership dues, donations, and the odd grant award are our only reliable sources of income. The moneys from those sources pays the bills and the staff, and they had essentially "evaporated". Where was the money going to come from? A question that was frequently asked is; "Can we use the interest generated by the investments for things such as operations and the like?". The short answer is," Yes!", with certain restrictions. By law we must use the original funds or the interest generated from the endowments as that money can only be used for the things that had been specifically designated. If they were designated for operational use, they can be used for that in an emergency situation, concurrent with board approval, as per our investment policy.

We are confident that we will be able to pickup the things that we had to postpone last year in 2020. The high value agricultural easement will

hopefully be formalized later on this year. This will enhance our viability as a land trust. The planning for the 2022 Sutter Buttes Calendar is underway and the photo submission period is open. We are well on our way to having the calendar production costs totally paid for by the selling of page sponsorships. The PPP loan program of the Small Business Administration was made available and we applied in 2020 and 2021 for the second draw. These loans were made available by the SBA to augment the payment of wages to employees, if you had a certain significant revenue loss in the quarters specified, and are forgivable if the funds are used as such. We were awarded the money on both of the loans to help pay the staff. We will still feel the pain of revenue loss, but it is not nearly as much as it could have been.


The land trust has been able to keep afloat by having Zoom meetings, and by the hard work of the very capable staff consisting of our Executive Director, Lisa Lindman, and Member Services Coordinator, Kim Mansfield. The two of them have kept up the important conservation work that is the heart of the organization

and the equally important work of the administration of the membership roster, planning the Sutter Buttes Calendar, and all the myriad other things SBRLT as a land trust must do to remain viable. Their dedication to the organization and their hard work is invaluable to the organization, and the board of directors and myself greatly appreciate it. Thank you, Lisa and Kim.



# JUST LIKE AN OLD ROADMAP, CALIFORNIA'S HISTORY CONTINUES TO UNFOLD!



A map tells us so much more than how to find our destination. What map are you using to get where you are going? If that's all you need, then a digital map on your cell phone is fine. As the Sutter Buttes Regional Land Trust, we use a variety of maps and we'd like to share some aspects of each one with you. Yes, we start with our hand-held device too.

But then we look back into the past for a historical perspective, and we find on old county maps from the late 1800's some of the local family names of people whose descendants still live around here and they are carrying on a family heritage that goes back for many generations. Those are the people that we want to work with. Or perhaps your family recently acquired a historic site and you wish to preserve its peaceful, arcadian ambiance. We want to work with you too.

As a nationally accredited land trust, we have the connections and resources to help such families preserve their heritage, their family history, so their young can carry on a priceless legacy. We use modern mapping tools today expedite documenting what you want to preserve and what you need to use to keep your family operation profitable.

Over the years, we have seen where a death or a divorce has led to the loss of a hundred-year tradition. Loss of farm and ranch land to developments or subdivision continues to climb at a higher rate than our populations. A recent review of California's Department of Conservation records reveals that over 30,000 acres have been lost between 2008 and 2018 in Sutter County alone!



We treasure our rural Colusa, Sutter, and Yuba County landscapes that attract millions of wintering waterfowl, numerous species of wildlife in the trees that line our roadways and the critters along the way that brighten our day! I still keep a Chamber of Commerce paper map in my truck which shows highways and byways, places for recreation, and destination sites along with ads that support local businesses that want to reach a regional clientele.

Do you enjoy a relaxing country drive? All of us can do something to help preserve the open spaces and agricultural operations that keep our pantries full and our landscape picturesque and uncluttered.
